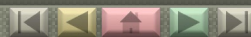

 - **Prisons & Jails** (Old, out dated information and lists)
 - **Parole & Probation** (Old, out dated information and lists)
 - **Shelters & Service Providers** (Limited information)
 - **The Yellow Pages** (Social Services & Welfare Section)
 - **Connect2Help or 2-1-1** (Limited information to the ReEntry industry)
 - **Indianapolis Private Industry Council** (Must have a login & password)
 - **Google & Yahoo type web searches** (Must know what you are searching for)
 - **Share Network Indiana** (Limited and outdated info for our industry – only 75 entries for Indy)
- **Now, those persons in need of help or persons that help persons in need of help, have access to:**
 - **www.IndyHelpers.com - You're all-in-one "Resource Center"**

The “seven most important components” needed to keep someone from going back to prison or jail are:

- 1. Information - (such as what HRH’s Web Site or 2-1-1 has to offer)**
 - The Inmate / ExOffender or someone working with them, such as a; case worker, family member, parole & probation officer, mentor, pastor, etc., must have access to information on the internet both before and after they get out, so they can identify the remaining components they will need to make a successful ReEntry.
- 2. Housing - (A place to go, and come home to)**
 - With family members, shelters, hotels, transitional or other supportive type housing
- 3. Professional Support - (counseling and/or treatment for)**
 - Substance abuse, medical problems, mental health & anger management, self-esteem & character building, and sometimes legal, etc.
- 4. Family and/or Mentor Support - (faith or community based)**
 - Relationships - Everyone needs someone they can depend on, and talk to.
 - Ask for a mentor & call upon family members, friends or your church for help
- 5. Jobs - (Full or part time) - Don’t overlook or underestimate the “Temp Services”**
 - Training, retraining, continuing education & placement for better paying jobs
- 6. Transportation -**
 - Bus passes, used autos, gas money, share ride programs
- 7. Basic needs stuff like -**
 - Food, clothes, hygiene items, medicine, mailing address, email service, a cell phone, driver’s license or state ID, Social Security Card, etc.

○ **Phase 4** - Expanded Notes

- **A Network of Volunteers / Helpers** (started May10)
- HRH surveyed 35 churches in 2009 and asked if they would be willing to volunteer in our prisons and/or our work release centers, etc. as volunteers, teachers, tutors, or mentors. Over 85% of them said “yes”. We also asked them why they had not volunteered before, and the almost unanimous answer was that “no one has ever asked”.
- HRH’s telemarketers are going to ask all of the churches for their help. Those interested, and what they are willing to do, will be posted on HRH’s web site and/or HRH will direct them to where they may be of help.

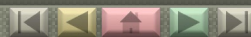
- **A Network of Housing & Job Providers** (coming soon)

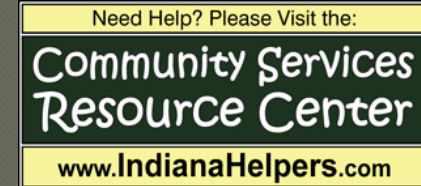
